TREASURER'S ISLAND



Hi—I do hope all of you had a fantastic July 4th celebration with your friends, family and all of your loved ones.

I hope you will always remember, “To a friend’s house, the road is never long.”

There was no CAC meeting in July. Our Handley Neighborhood Meeting met on July 13th. Our speaker was Officer Monty Lambert. He gave a fantastic talk on the experiences of first responders to a tragedy. He was one of the first responders in Galveston. Handley Code Blue Meeting met on July 20th. We had two surprise guests, Judith Goins and Emila Love from the Fort Worth Police Communications Department. Judith is Assistant Division Manager and Emila Love is Assistant Supervisor. The Fort Worth Police Communications Department has 140 employees and it’s a part of the Fort Worth Police Department’s Operational Support Bureau. Police Communications is the “Public Safety Answering Point for all 911 calls in Fort Worth. They can dispatch on 5 channels to approximately 250 police officers at a time. They answer all incoming non-emergency calls, transfer all fire and medical calls to either Fire Dept. or Medstar, answer all incoming 10 digit police emergency calls and monitor alarms for city properties. You call the emergency number 911 for life threatening situations and crimes in progress. The non-emergency number you can call is 817-335-4222. This number is to be used for non life-threatening situations, crimes that have occurred in the past and the suspects are no longer in the area, information requests, and quality-of-life/nuisance type calls. In 2008 they received 1,177,501 Calls; 681,934 calls originated from 911, 72,063 calls from 10 digit police emergency and

423,504 calls on the non emergency line. Seventy-two percent of all 911 calls are from cell phones. The priority of a call determines not just the code response, but also the time allowed to dispatch the call. Priority 1: TWO minutes. Priority 2: EIGHT minutes and Priority 3: FORTY-FIVE minutes. The Communications Dept. operates 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, weekends and holidays included. Judith and Emila have promised to return to our meetings to bring us up to date news on their department and to hear from us if we have any questions or problems in communicating with them. It was a very interesting meeting. One of our Code Blue & Handley Neighborhood members just celebrated their 80th birthday. “Happy Birthday, Ira Noble,” and many more to come. Thanks for always picking up our pizza for our Code Blue meetings.

For those of you who like BBQ, Smokey’s on East Lancaster has opened up under new ownership. Doris & I have tried it out and the BBQ and potato salad are delicious. They make their own bread for the sandwiches and do they ever pile on the meat. The prices are good and on Sundays they have a special for \$5.95. The owner’s son is the manager, when he is not being an officer on the Wills Point Police Department. Go by and welcome them to the area and try out their delicious food.

Folks, we are in need of help. We need donations to the “Museum Fund.” There is talk of placing jars at all the businesses in Handley and at our meetings for these donations. TRACKING THE INTERURBAN'S HISTORY

60-mph train speeded between Fort Worth and Dallas until 1934

This article was published in the Star Telegram and written by Debra McGuire, a Star Telegram writer.

The Interurban trains connecting Fort Worth and Dallas combined speed and luxury. This is not a story to read while locked in rush hour traffic in East Fort Worth. This is the story about a plush-seated, chandeliered, gilt-interior train designed to race back and forth between Dallas and Fort Worth at 60-plus miles per hour. It raced its last in 1934. The Interurban, an electric-powered rail line along 35 miles of 70-lb. steel rails, connected Fort Worth and Dallas in the early 1900's. The North Texas Traction Company sent two trains an hour between the two cities along tracts that parallel Highway 80. One train, the local, stopped at places like Handley and Sycamore Hill. A neighborhood grew up around another stop, Stop Six. The Crimson Limited made hourly non-stop trips between Dallas and Fort Worth. The train's average speed was 60-70 miles per hour; Interurban's motto was "Speed is Safety."

An article in The Bohemian, a 1910-era newspaper, said cars ran from 6:00 a.m. to 11 p.m., "passing in front of the major hotels of both cities. "Mail cars ran at night, to deliver newspapers between Fort Worth and Dallas.

Betty Burgess, a local historian, said the Interurban's reliability was renowned. "It left Fort Worth and Dallas on the hour, and they said you could set your clock by it." Burgess said.

People not only set their clocks by the Interurban, those who could not afford cars moved to within walking distance of the depots, and others built houses in sight of the tracts, Burgess said. "Some of the larger houses like the Fielder House were built, they say, because you could sit on the front porch and watch the Interurban," she said. In the headlong flight between Dallas and Fort Worth, the electric-powered train sometimes collided with unwary automobiles, Burgess said. The Village Creek/Brush Creek area at Handley was a particularly hazardous site. There are stories...there is one engine of the Interurban that went down in quicksand and could not be retrieved," she said.

Ophelia White is a retired principal at East Handley Elementary School. Her father, Edward L. White, was chief engineer of the power plant that generated electricity for the Interurban and for Fort Worth's street car system. "Just beyond Village Creek, they had a little place called Death Crossing because the cars would pull up in front, and there was no way for the Interurban to stop," Ophelia White recalled. "They would put the car into reverse instead of using just the brakes. They could tell at the power plant when that happened because it used a lot of electric-

ity. They called that “old man White’s brakes.”

Summer Sundays, the Interurban carried picnickers out to Lake Erie; a Northern Texas Traction Co. built 30-acre lake and resort in Handley. Vernon and Irene Castle danced at a concert pavilion overlooking the lake in the days before World War I while Castle was stationed at an air base at Benbrook, Burgess said.

It was a quieter, slower time, a time when a train ride was special, and when the round trip between Fort Worth and Handley only cost 20 cents. It was a big feat of a Sunday afternoon for a young man to bring a young woman and a picnic basket out here to Handley,” Burgess said.

Time and fast cars finally over-took the Interurban. Service between Fort Worth and Dallas stopped in 1934. Lake Erie was drained in 1956. A few remnants of the Interurban remain—rusting sections of tracks, decaying old buildings that once were substations for the power plant and cars, salvaged as museum pieces. “I still, in my mind, wonder, why can’t this come back.” Burgess said.

History - Handley Meadowbrook Christian Church

Handley Meadowbrook Christian Church was built at 3128 Forrest Ave in the Spring of 1921 and was originally named First Christian Church, Handley, Texas. Members of the congregation did most of the construction work.

In 1945, A lot was purchased at 2812 Forrest Ave to build a parsonage. In 1947, the membership changed the church's name to Handley Christian Church.

In 1953, the membership decided to move and purchased a lot at 6020 Meadowbrook Dr. They broke ground on May 22, 1954 to build a new sanctuary, fellowship hall, an adult's department, and a children's department. The old building was sold to the Assembly of God church. The members of the congregation decided to change the name to Handley Meadowbrook Christian Church. It was dedicated on February 27, 1955 and is located on the same spot to this day.

Our congregation finished a huge building project in the summer of 1999. We finished adding a playground to the church property. The building additions included a new entrance, a circle drive with covered drop/pick up area, handicap accessible restrooms in the front of the church, and remodeling the upstairs and downstairs restrooms. In early 2004, HMCC added a new audio/visual system to the sanctuary for multimedia presentations. In September of 2005, HMCC purchased a new 10 passenger van for Sunday morning worship pickup and to take church members to camps and retreats. There are also plans under way in the next few years to add additional classrooms and build a Family Life Center next to the church.
