## THE HANDLEY NEWS OCTOBER 27, 1949

*The Handley News in October 27, 1949 was the only Newspaper in Handley. Thanks to Pat Brown for giving me these old newsletters, so that some of us can enjoy and reminisce about those long ago years, that have slipped by so very swiftly.*

Do some of you remember the Smith and Putman's Jewelry Store that was located just south of the post office? There was also a water office next door to the jewelry store. Both the jewelry store and water office were robbed and the safe was loaded into a truck. The police found the safe later in a field a few miles south of Grand Prairie. The safe had been blown and pieces of jewelry were scattered everywhere.

This burglary stuff is becoming rather common in Handley and it would seem certain that we shall be compelled to seek better protection than we have at present. If the city can do nothing to protect us, it will be up to the people here to devise some plan that will give us a measure of protection against burglars and thieves.

Personality of the week was Bobby South, Handley High's golden-toed Senior. He was known for his football maneuvers and he also played basketball. During work day, Bob hauled scrap iron for Red Duncan and also cleaned up lawns. When interviewed Coach Harris had to say, "Bob is the most conscientious boy I've ever known. Modesty, too, is one of Bob's fine qualities." His nickname was "Bugger Red." Bobby South is a Handley High School Alumni member.

STUDENTS DISCUSS UNITED NATIONS— IN OBSERVANCE OF United Nations Day, the second period American History had a panel discussion in class, Monday, October 23, 1949. Betty Chilcoat was chairman of the group. Dick Caruthers discussed the organization of the United Nations. Evelyn Cloud told what countries were members. Kenneth Moore gave the aims of the United Nations and Sarah Gullede discussed some of the problems settled and to be settled by the United Nations. Charts were prepared by Marjorie Parker and Johnnie Lou McLeod.

A wire recorder was purchased by the speech department from proceeds received from the two plays, "The Tale of a Shirt" and "Tom Sawyer", given by the Speech Club of 1948. The wire recorder was to be used in all departments. In speech, students can hear their voices and improve enunciation and pronunciation. The music Dept. can improve their tone quality.

CARUTHERS SELECTED MAYOR OF OUR TOWN---In a recent meeting of the Texas Chapter, Fort Worth and Handley Chapter of DeMolay Councilors, our own senior, Dick Caruthers, was elected to be Mayor of Ft. Worth, on Friday, November 25, 1949. On this day, the DeMolays of Ft. Worth, actually "run the town." The purpose of Civic Day for the DeMolays is not only for pleasure, but for a better understanding of civic affairs. Dick Caruthers was later killed in the war.

Handley had another first---the first ventilators. This particular ventilator, designed by Mr. Scarborough, was in-

stalled in room 303 where movies were shown. It was similar in design to some used in the Navy. They were so shaped that all light was excluded from the room, but plenty of fresh air can enter. Handley was the only school at that time to install this new type ventilator.
