The Handley Neighborhood Association met on Monday, May 11, 2009 at the Handley United Methodist Church. President Joann Ehlers called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. Will Dryden opened the meeting with a prayer.

The minutes were read and approved as read. The Treasurer's report was also read and approved. The following announcements were made by President Joann Ehlers:

Dedication of memorial park will be held June 5 at Trinity Park. Parking at Farrington Field is available with bus taking you to Trinity Park.

There is a new animal ordinance on large dogs.

On May 23, HNA is invited by the Historical Society held at Thistle Hill. Handley Historical will display a board of pictures of historical homes in the Handley area.

NPO Kim Gardner reported:

The crime comparison for the past month to 2008.

Code Compliance Officer Phillip Van Horn reported on illegal dumping being on the rise. There are six people working in unmarked vehicles looking for evidence of persons doing the dumping. Anyone seeing anyone doing illegal dumping should call police immediately. Dennis Mitchell reported that the Code Rangers are still active but wants to get more people involved.

As a result of the article by Betty Coomer, Smitty's Little White Church has found a temporary home at 3121 Handley Drive. Members of the Handley Historic Development Corp., relocated the church last week. Restoration has begun and once completed, visitors and Handley residents will again enjoy Christmas music through out the holiday season as Smitty's Little White Church brings in the New Year. Rumor has it that the Easter Bunny will be dropping by the little church next year to hide eggs for the first annual Handley Easter Egg Hunt.

Eastside Fund Raiser for Eastside Ministries By Betty Drinkard Coomer

Our annual Eastside Gospel Fund Raiser for Eastside Ministries is fast approaching. The date has been set for July 18th, 2009, at Saint Matthews United Methodist Church at 2414 Hitson Lane at 5:30 p.m. Everyone is welcome. This is for a very worthy cause. This is our Fourth annual Eastside Ministries Gospel Night Fund Raiser. This is a place where Eastsiders of all ages can come and join in singing many old time Gospel Songs. The piano artistry of Audria Langdon and Linda Washington is something to behold. It promises to be an evening you won't soon forget.

Following the singing and instrumental renditions of favorite hymns, Pastor Max Brennan will welcome everyone, and then you will be fed at a fellowship dinner consisting of sugar-cured ham, home-baked beans, potato salad, slaw and delicious desserts of pies and cakes, made and donated by member churches.

Through donations and ticket sales more than \$3,000 was raised for Eastside Ministries including an extra \$1,000.00 donated by Thrivent Financial for Lutherans last year.

Since 1985 Eastside Ministries has been a rescuer for needy families in zip codes 76103, 76112 and 76120. It began when a group of ministers and lay persons met to address the increasing number of requests for assistance at their churches. They believed that by joining together they could be relieved of the need to maintain individual pantries and closets. Also, a tracking system would cut down on abuse of scarce resources and enable more people to be served. They formed a non-profit 501 C3 corporation governed by a Board of Trustees. The

The History of 6717 Craig Street

Sarah Gray Mason a widow, moved to Texas in 1836.

She married Thomas J. Jennings in Nacogdoches on January 10th, 1844.

She was granted under patent, 736 acres east of Ft. Worth on March 1st, 1847 by Governor E. M. Pease for immigrating to Texas. The metes and bounds include references to several trees which are most probably gone now.

She acquired additional properties in the area and in 1873 donated the land for Ft. Worth's first park, Hyde Park in downtown Fort Worth. The park was named for her parents John Hansford Hyde and Polly Strother Gray Hyde.

Thomas died on September 23rd, 1881 in Ft. Worth. Her sons, Tom R. Jennings and Hyde Jennings, an attorney, inherited the property upon Sarah's death on April 6th, 1893.

Tom sold his interest to Hyde on April 20th, 1893. (First note of the town of Handley in the records).

Hyde established the Hyde Jennings subdivision and deeded streets and alleys to the town on February 25th, 1903. He owned numerous properties in Ft. Worth. (Whether inherited or acquired separately isn't indicated in our records.)

Hyde died December 11th, 1903 and willed the property to his wife Florence and their children. Florence sold block 4 and the west half of block 9 to J. R. Jones on February 1st, 1905 for \$1,021.81 which was paid off in 1906.

J.R. sold the portion of block 9 to John T. Halbert on December 29th, 1911 for \$1,000. At that time the property was on Craig Street but the street to west was called East Street (now Halbert Street) and the street to the east was called Baker Street (now Hunter Street). Handley Drive was called Jennings Street. This information was found in the Alamo Title Abstract dated June 18th, 1912.

The house was built by John Thomas Halbert and Marie E. Halbert; one of his original dinner plates remains. John Halbert took out a loan for the lumber from Owens Lumber Company on June 20th, 1912 and paid it off on June 20th, 1914. We believe that the house was completed in November of 1912. The county records burned in 1929 (for the second time, they also burned in 1876) so reconstructing the actual construction date would be difficult.

Thomas Halbert obtained a certificate of clear title From Stewart Title on December 10th, 1946 which is probably when he sold the property to its second owner, Mr. Glenn Smith.

A 1951 plat shows the properties along the east side of Halbert Street separate from 6717 Craig street. This is probably when Mr. Smith subdivided.

Glenn and Betty Smith bought the property from Glenn Smith (no relation) in 1979 and sold it to Linda and Paul Kerpoe on July 31, 2007.

HNA speaker was Karen Greenwood from the Fort Worth Cats Baseball Team. Karen gave an interesting history of the Cats which started in 1988. This year, the Cats are reaching out to all neighborhood associations by offering box seat tickets for \$7. A fireworks display will be held every Friday night and on Memorial day.

Board is composed of two representatives from each member church.

They purchased an old abandoned service station at 5929 E. Lancaster and with the help of volunteer workers and donated materials converted the structure into a service center. The result is a pleasing reception area, intake office, clothing “shopping” and storage rooms and a large pantry—conveniently located on a bus line. Eastside Ministries is open Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to noon. It is occasionally open on Saturdays also.

The Board of Trustees meets monthly to direct and oversee the ministry. Jan Havins, a social worker, serves as executive director. She supervises a staff of four and a corps of volunteers. Many of the clients are elderly, handicapped or have incomes at or below the federal poverty level. These clients are eligible for food once a month and clothing four times a year. Residents in the service area, who are experiencing hardships due to job loss or other emergencies, may receive food and clothing four times a year. An increasing number includes homeless families with children. These are given food that does not require kitchen facilities and clothes. They too, are helped four times a year.

Seasonal programs include “Back to School,” and Thanksgiving and Christmas food baskets. The ministry is supported by 13 neighborhood churches from seven denominations plus corporate support from Universal Heath Services. They have been a tremendous support.

Food is purchased from the Tarrant Area Food Bank and donations of canned food and staples such as cereal are always welcome. Good, clean used clothing is also in demand. In addition to financial support from churches and organizations and individuals, grants provide a substantial portion of Eastside’s annual budget. If you would like more information on Eastside Ministries you can call 817-446-3278 during business hours. You can also make memorial donations to Eastside Ministries.

As you can see, this is a very worth while endeavor to help less fortunate members of our areas. There, but for the grace of God, could be you or I. Our tickets are just \$5.00 each and for this you get entertained and fed. We are hoping to get some entertainment from each church. We will take up a love offering.

So, if you want to come to some good old time knee-slapping, toe tapping gospel music, you don’t want to miss coming on the 18th of July to our Gospel Fundraiser for Eastside Ministries. St. Matthew’s address is 2414 Hitson Lane, Ft. Worth, TX., 76112. If we have any cakes or pies left, they will be auctioned off to the highest bidder and believe you me, our cooks are fantastic and make delicious desserts.
