The Handley Neighborhood Association met on Monday, April 13, 2009 at the Handley United Methodist Church. President Joann Ehlers called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. JoAnn Wells opened the meeting with a prayer. The minutes were read and approved as read. The Treasurer's report was also read and approved. The following announcements were made by President Joann Ehlers:

- Libraries will be closed on April 22 for staff development.
- Forest Avenue United Methodist Church will have a pancake breakfast on April 18 at 9:00-10:30am.
- Prairie Fest, 3400 View Street will be held on April 25 10am-8pm
- A meeting will be held at Meadowbrook Community Center at 6:30pm on paving streets passed in the 2004 Bond election.
- Cars parked in backyards to be removed.
- Scammers are calling stating they are with credit card companies and are wanting the security code off of credit cards.
- Karen Granwood from Fort Worth Cats Baseball will be at the May meeting. Need to get a group together to go. Tickets are \$7.

- CERT (Community Emergency Response Teams) training May 18, 2009. Go to website www.fwcert.org, click on new member.
- Auto Etching/Heat Registration detail Saturday, April 25, 2009 from 12:00noon to 4:00pm at police storefront, 5701 Shelton or 2219 Weiler Bldg #2 complex next to Eastern Hills High School. Code Compliance Dennis Mitchell stressed that everyone should report suspicions to police. Code Rangers is still available. Program is set up to call in or online and you will remain anonymous. There will be new ordinances requiring paved or concrete surfaces for parking and will go in effect in May of June, 2009.

It cannot be seen from your neighbor’s back yard, even if it’s behind a fence. Residents can report a junk vehicle at www.FortWorthGov.Org/codecompliance or by calling 817-392-1234. How many of you know that you can look on your electric bill and see what you are getting charged per KWh? I had the electrician come check things out at my home after I had received a \$1069.00 electric bill. The sex offenders have to notify authorities 7 days before they move from one place to another and supply them with their new address. HISTORY OF HANDLEY BY DAVID DUNNETT

Continued from April Newsletter:

One of the first Boy Scout Troops of the Council was here, in-fact two of them. Troop 93 and 86 were sponsored by the Methodist and Baptist men. The troops were combined and at one time over 100 boys belonged. Mr. Leslie T. Smith, who lives on Craig St. opposite the Middle School, spoke so lovingly of his many years associating with this group, of help from Mr. Waddell and the bank and of T.C. Duncan's support. The old depot that I mentioned earlier, no longer needed, was put on the sale block. There were no buyers and it was given to the Scouts, if they would tear it down. Mean while the boys had started a concrete building on Craig Street, so the lumber salvaged from the depot was used as the roof decking. The land had been given by the Smith brothers, (no relation to Mr. Leslie Smith,) and today this building is still in service and is owned by the Longhorn Council, not any one particular Troop.

Churches flourished from the small Union Church at the beginning. The Baptists chose to build on the now present site of Handley Baptist Church, first starting with a basement, which they used until they could build more. Mr. Weiler, the depot agent, is said to have been given the first land for a Presbyterian Church located at Routt and Forest, just opposite the Old Lodge Hall, formerly a grocery store, The white building now used by the Baptists was the forerunner of the beautiful Handley Methodist Church. Time saw other changes, Church splits and other denominations come in. St. Rita's was a small wooden building about 1907 to 1908 and the Riley or O'Riley family was instrumental in this start.

A log post-office was located at Handley Dr. and East Lancaster. Here stories vary some. Mrs. Weiler was one of the first postmistresses, but Mrs. Calais was believed to have been an earlier one. S. H. Haynie operated a General Store on Lancaster at his home. Mr. Joe Hart was the first blacksmith, Handley boasted two phones at the beginning, one belonged to Mr. Earl Waddell and the other to Dr. Frank Norris. The Norris family owned land where the present 40 Oaks Shopping Center is located. To call Fort Worth was a toll call. Mrs. Joyner was a later operator and she was quite adapt at knowing voices. If you were visiting a neighbor or had the phone to ring and couldn't get in to answer quite soon enough, you could call her later and be connected with your party. Dr. A. E. Graham lived on the hill where Handley Middle School now is, using his horse and buggy to get about in. Dr. Herschel Thomas was another early doctor.

Water was had by cisterns or from a central well at Forest and Kerr Streets. You pumped by hand and paid 5c a barrel. Two flowing wells were located on Forest, another on Canton Street. There is no explanation as to what happened to these wells; were they used up, dried up, or what?

If you would like to view a bit of Handley nostalgia, drive by the Leslie T. Smith home on Craig Street opposite the Middle School Field and you will see a miniature church. While not built by Mr. Smith, it was a boyhood dream of his and was built by a Mr. S.W. Byrd of Arkansas Lane. Some of the glass from the old Presbyterian Church is also used, as is the glass from the ticket window of the old T & P Depot. Mrs. Beard crocheted the alter linens with crosses in them.

and that the neighborhood looks better. Sky Watch is at Home Depot and due to the wind is at a lower level and will probably move to Target.

HNA speaker was Rob Bauereisen, master gardener at Botanic Gardens. Botanic Gardens grow their own plants and Rob invited everyone to come to the spring and fall plant sales. The Japanese Gardens Spring Festival will be April 18 & 19. Rob had samples of the most common weeds in our area, chickweed, henbit and dandelion. Should use week killers to control weeds and can use vinegar and water in a spray bottle to spray directly on plant. Rob gave may tips on types of fertilizer, ant control, tomato plants and watering.

John Hahn spoke on Neighbor Helping Neighbor. HNH has been in existence for two years in our area and is in coordination with area agency on aging which assists socially isolated elderly individuals. Assistance includes transportation, minor home repairs, shopping assistance, installing wheelchair ramps, safety equipment and yard maintenance. There is a bill before the Texas Legislature to assist socially isolated elderly individuals and would take effect September 1, 2009.

Mabi Ramirez of Community Relations Department reported that Prairie Fest will have training on how to properly recycle.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:00pm.
