AUGUST 10, 2009

The Handley Neighborhood Association met on Monday, August 10, 2009 at the Handley United Methodist Church. President Joann Ehlers called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. Hez Bellows opened the meeting with a prayer.

The minutes were read and approved as read. The Treasurer's report was also read and approved. The following announcements were made by President Joann Ehlers:

The Daiquri ladies' liquor license was approved. Letters were written by Mike Harrison, the President of HHDC and Joann Ehlers to the TABC and to the judge about opposition to the place. A petition was also passed out opposing the business. Also, other neighborhood associations were also opposing it.

Checks can be sent to P.O. Box 8189, Fort Worth, TX 76124 made payable to the Historic Handley Railroad Museum.

Doris Harrison reminded everyone about the Eleventh Handley Festival that will be the second weekend in October. Doris Harrison asked people to make handmade things to sell in a craft booth. They should bring any handmade things to the store. Joann is making a quilt to raffle.

The following reports were given:

NPO Kim Gardner reported the crime statistics from July 25-31 thru August 1-7, 2009.

The first week there were 13 offenses including 3 burglaries of habitations, 4 burglary of vehicles and 3 thefts. There were 6 offenses the second week with 4 being thefts. NPO's are on details burglaries and have caught several. Peak offense time is 8PM – 12PM.

Yard of the month for August is Iva Mae Lassiter at 7133 Jewell.

Betty Coomer, Code Blue, reported that Fort Worth was first to start Code Blue training in 1991. The Gun Buy Back Program will be held on August 15 2PM – 6PM at 3727 Miller St. to try to get guns off the street. Will give \$50 certificate and will ask no questions. All vacant buildings should be boarded up where no one can enter.

Councilman Frank Moss spoke that the city budget will be presented to the council tomorrow

When I was growing up in Handley I remember lots of good times. I came from a large old family here in Handley, the Routts. I can remember when Handley was a town by itself with our own

fire truck, Dr. Foster's clinic, grocery stores, and a corner drug store with soda fountain. I also remember my future husband and others "hanging around" the corner drug store to watch the girls go by! My grandmother had a post office box in the Handley Post Office as there was no house to house deliver/ of mail. Her address was Box 2, Handley, Texas. We also boasted a second drug store run by the Lynch's. There was a branch library in back part of the 5 and 10 store run by Miss Virgie Smith. We also had barber shops, beauty shop, bank, and picture show. I remember when we had the old telephones hung on the wall and had to crank it to get the operator to answer to connect us with the number we wanted.

I remember sleeping outside during the summer and not concerned about being outside. There was no need to lock door to our houses. We felt safe as could be.

We had good artisan water from our own Handley well. When Fort Worth annexed Handley, we had to use the Fort Worth water and lots of people didn't like it. It was "hard" water and we were used to "soft" water. Also, when Fort Worth put in the street lights on East Lancaster, the street was closed one night to celebrate with dancing and visiting. The lights were a great improvement and it was called "The Great White Way."

The churches were very important to the people of Handley. I was a member of the Handley Methodist Church on the corner of Forest Ave and Church Street where the fire house now stands. When I was married in the church in the summer time, I remember the candles on the altar were melting before the services were over. Of course, no air conditioning.

The Handley Elementary School (on the same property on East Lancaster as the old Cowtown Inn which was recently torn down) consisted of the first grade through the sixth grade. Then we attended the old Handley High School on Haynie. The grades consisted of seventh through the twelfth. There was not a large number of students and everyone knew everyone, even who went out

on a date over the week-end. The old school stood for many years as my parents went to the old Handley High School too.

My girl friends and I use to ride bikes on Meadowbrook Drive. It was out in the country with just trees and a narrow street - no houses.

When we needed to go to Fort Worth, we had to buy a bus ticket at the corner drug store to catch a Greyhound bus that would take us to downtown. We would do our shopping there and sometimes take in a picture show.

While in High School the new football field needed lights so games could be played a night. The residents and business men of Handley got high school kids to work in the stores and in their homes. All money made was then combined to install the lights.

There was no lunch room at the high school, so we had to leave at noon to get something to eat or bring our lunch and eat in the balcony of the auditorium. I lived close to home so I walked home for lunch. I was lucky to have my Mom at home all day.

I enjoyed living in a small town. The friends that I made in high school ended up being friends for life. There are still a lot of people located in the Handley area that have been here for a very long time. I have lived in the same house in the Handley area for 50 years. How time does fly.

HANDLEY KEEPS HISTORICAL FEEL
AREA IS LIKE A TRIP THROUGH TIME

The front and back doors of Brown Furniture were ajar. Indian summer breezes were breaking the shop's stillness. There were no customers late last Wednesday afternoon as Charles Brown, 65, sat leisurely behind the counter.

The blades of the antique pocket knives he hoped to sell looked sharp enough, but he peered over his eyeglass rims just to make sure. Brown and his wife, Eva, 70, were taking advantage of the slowdown in business as homebound workers in cars hummed past. The building that houses their 6517 E. Lancaster Ave. business was built in 1918 during the early days of Handley, a township Fort Worth annexed in 1947. Walking through the neighborhood is like taking a trip back in time.

The Browns moved their shop to Handley 25 years ago from a building on Houston Street, where part of Tarrant County Convention Center now sits. Handley is bounded by Meadowbrook Drive on the north, Texas and Pacific Railroad and E. Lancaster on the south, Tierney Boulevard on the west and Cooks Lane on the east. Antique rockers, planters, tools and tables lining a sidewalk outside the store are an enticement to ever greater things, the gray haired couple said. Inside 13 foot high white ceilings laden with large clover like designs are intact. A more than 35 year old Emerson ceiling fan still whirs above. A hip-high swinging wooden gate separates the cash register area from a narrow showroom.

"This is really just Handley. All the old store fronts are exactly as they were," Brown said, pulling a slender 3-foot long photograph from behind the counter. "It's an atmosphere that attracts people's attention, and it's been good for business." Brown's yard long photo taken in 1927 shows the 6500 and 6600 blocks of East Lancaster that held retail shops, offices and a bank. Across the street is a rail-road depot.

Several yards down the avenue is the barn-shaped Howell Feed Store, which still does business. The depot and First National Bank of Handley are gone from the strip, along with artesian wells that were scattered throughout Handley. Gone also is the small, white-washed Union Church that was used on alternate Sundays by Baptist, Presbyterian and Methodist churchgoers. It was next to the historically marked Handley Cemetery, east of the Texas Electric Service Company plant on East Lancaster. Those things were demolished long before Bettye Bur-

gess, her husband John, and two children moved to Handley from the South Side in 1964. Handley was a place of clean air, cheap living and friendly neighbors she said. Cows grazed in grassy backyards amid wildly growing splotches of red and yellow Indian paintbrush. As recently as the 1970's children rode horses in fields across from Burgess's 1930's ranch-style home on Sandy Lane. To hear some tell it, the living hasn't been so good since annexation. Even the water, they say, doesn't taste the same. The area has changed since 1947. World War 11 brought a housing boom, but many of the area's old residents have died, or moved away, and aging homes have been demolished in recent years.

The heart of old Handley—officially dubbed East Handley—is bordered by Loop 820 on the east, Meadowbrook on the north and the Texas and Pacific Railroad on the south. West Handley—west of that neighborhood—is bounded by Tierney on the west, 820 on the east, Meadowbrook on the north, East Lancaster on the south. Handley Hitson—east of Old Handley—is bounded by Sandy Lane on the west, Cooks Lane on the east, Meadowbrook on the north and Arlington city limits on the south. Much of the housing stock in old Handley was built during World War II and the 1950's. Some, however, sprang up before 1900, including Nellie Mae Rennel's Handley Drive home that was built in 1916.

To be continued in October 2009 Newsletter Betty "Drinkard" Coomer I remember going in Brown's Store with my Mom, Bonnie Drinkard,—so very many years ago.

night and that there may be many things that may be impacting the East side. He encouraged people to send letters to him to support the Railroad Station area for Handley as it is critical and we need to move on it.

HNA speaker was Shirlee Wilkinson, Code Blue Coordinator of the Fort Worth Police Department. Shirlee has been the Code Blue Coordinator for thirteen years and has won many awards. The Fort Worth Code Blue was started in 1991 with the first class graduating 102 members. Code Blue has trained over 5000 members with 1600 still being active. Training consists of 8 hours classroom training and 8 hours with police officer. Uniforms are provided by the City of Fort Worth. Shirlee encouraged Code Blue people to take the refresher course that has been updated. Survey also showed that people wanted more training. During the Citizen Police Academy twelve week course (1day per week) you learn the different depts. of the police Department. If interested see your NPO. All programs are very rewarding.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:00pm.
